This datalayer consists of points identified by Chichester Conservation Commission members. They were digitized specifically for this inventory.

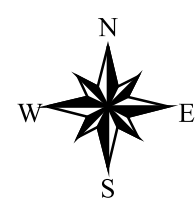
**REGIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL / CULTURAL FEATURES:**

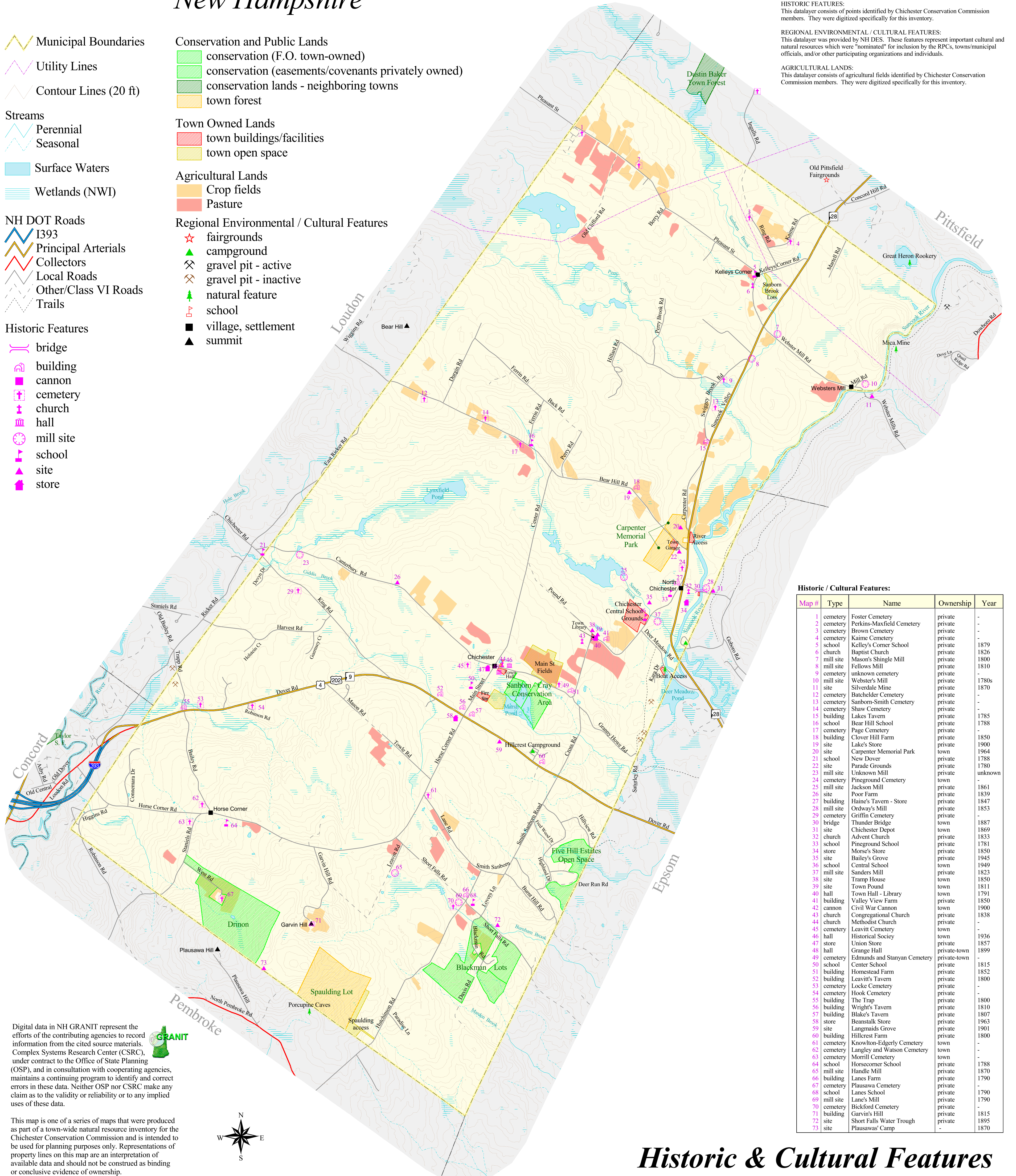
