Call to Order: Mr. Bouchard called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm

Mr. Bouchard opened the meeting at 6:00pm

Public Budget Hearing

Mr. MacKinnon, the moderator, went though the budget line by line stopping for the public's questions.

Mrs. Pinard notated that she had changed line 3120 from \$15,000 to \$22,400 and line 3509 from \$23,000 to \$23,500 with regards to the revenues.

Mr. Mann asked where the 8% COLA figure came from.

Mr. Bouchard explained that COLA is up over 8% currently and that in the years past the Town has always went with at least COLA. He stated that there were other cuts made to ensure that the employees would be able to receive a pay adjustment.

Mr. Millette stated that we have used COLA as a standard for a number of years. Some years pay studies have been utilized. The Town has always maintained at least cola and we have not done a market study in the few years or since covid.

Mr. Moore asked about the work that needs to be done on Fredwood Drive.

Mr. Bouchard stated that it will come out of the road reconstruction line.

Mr. Moore stated that the development started in late 70's with its own roads. Around 1980 the Town discussed taking over the Roads, but the people who lived there needed to bring it up to Town standards, which was a surcharge for 10 years. We paid to have a paved road and would like to keep a paved road.

Mr. Millette stated that it is going to be repaired this year with road reconstruction lines.

The total amount to be raised is \$2,108,150.00 that is an increase of 4.27% in the amount of \$86,386.00 if the operating budget and all special warrant articles pass at town meeting.

Fire Department-

Chief Quimby stated that Mr. Sanborn went to do a final inspection for the new truck, which is slated to arrive in NH in a couple weeks, which will then go to the Lakes region fire to get outfitted.

Chief Quimby reported in January there were 51 calls of service including a building fire on pleasant St. There was also a snow mobile accident with a broken leg on trial.

Ambulance two is now back in service.

Chief Quimby reported that there was training held with both the Fire and Police departments for training in the warm zone. They plan to continue to work together.

Police Department-

Chief Wright reported 109 calls of service in January, only four of which were motor vehicle accidents.

He stated that he has received two quotes for the PD doors and is waiting for a third.

Chief Wright reported working together with the Fire Department to do EMS in the warm zone training and is hoping to set up more.

Officer Wood passed her entrance exam and is expected to graduate from the Police Academy in June.

Chief Wright asked to accept a donation in the amount of \$4,000 for training from Global Partners. He would like to do additional training for ground fighting doing Brazilian jujitsu for the department.

Mr. Bouchard made a motion and Mr. Millette seconded to accept funds pursuant to RSA 31:19 the board of selectman shall accept an authorized expenditures of unanticipated funds in the amount of \$4,000.00 for training to be done for the Police Department. Roll call vote. Millette, aye. MacCleery, aye. Bouchard, aye. **Motion passes.**

Highway-

Mr. Sykes reported that the Highway Department has been busy with storms. He reported that they have been doing patrol work getting an idea of what needs to be replaced.

Mr. Sykes reported that they are approaching the end phase of getting the 550-truck delivered.

Mr. Sykes reported that he has been addressing drainage issues on Staniels Road.

He reported that the shed is stocked up on product for the rest of the season.

Mr. Sykes reported that there is a logger who has asked to utilize Granny Howe Road and is willing to provide a bond for use. He would like to check with the Town engineer to provide a dollar amount for the bond. He is concerned about the road being torn up. He asked for permission to move forward with the bond and protect our interest.

Mrs. Pinard suggested using a weight limit for Granny Howe Road. She stated that the Town already receives complaints all the time and the road will be damaged.
