


The Greek Revival post and beam building was built on/near the site of the Town's 18th century Meeting House at a cost of \$571.21. Constructed in 1845-1847, it served as the seat of town government and a central meeting place for more than 140 years as well as serving as the Town Library since 1899. Listed in the NH State Register of Historic Places in 2012.

POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE COMMISSION

as outlined in the Statute (RSA 674:44-b) as follows:

- Survey and inventory historical and cultural resources.
- Assist the Planning Board, if requested, in the development and review of those sections of the Master Plan which address historical, cultural, and scenic resources.
- · Conduct research and publish findings.
- Advise, upon request, local agencies and other local boards on matters pertaining to historical, cultural and scenic resources.
- Coordinate activities, programs and events with appropriate service organizations and non-profit groups.
- Publicize its activities to keep citizens informed.
- Hire consultants and contractors as needed.
- Perform a study to assess the value in creating a local historic district and prepare an ordinance for it.
- Receive gifts of money and property, both real and personal, in the name of the Town, subject to the approval of the Board of Selectmen, such gifts to be managed and controlled by the Commission for its proper purposes.
- Hold meetings and hearings necessary to carry out its duties.


MEMBERSHIP

"A membership of seven members and three alternate members, including one member from the local governing body, shall be appointed in accordance with the provisions of RSA 673:4a by the Board of Selectmen. Terms of regular and alternate members shall be for one to three years and shall be staggered."

Commission meetings are held each month of the calendar year on the 3rd Thursday at 7 pm in the Chichester Town Library, 161 Main Street. Meetings are open to the public. Your interest and participation is appreciated.

MISSION STATEMENT

The charge of the Heritage Commission is to preserve community character. The Commission works in an advisory capacity to recognize and preserve historical, cultural, and scenic resources valued for their aesthetic and community significance.
